Azalea City Quilters' Guild—General Meeting St. Mark United Methodist Church—April 12, 2016

President Janet Beaverstock called the meeting to order at 10:00 am and welcomed everyone. Joyce Reed gave the inspiration.

Carol Peterson reported a treasury balance of \$6,187.56 as of March 31, 2016. The Money Market account balance as \$8221.19.

Susan Mogan announced that there were 56 members and 2 guests - Ruth and Sue Beckner, in attendance. The total membership now stands at 213.

Barbara Smith said that the Linus Quilt workshop and the Design & Color workshop taught by Susan Morgan were both successful. She would like someone in Baldwin Co. to head a workshop for the Linus Quilts. Janice Andrews will teach the May 23rd workshop on stained glass. Janie Lloyd and Mary Warfield will teach the June workshop on the EQ7 computer software.

Susan Digman announced new books added to the library: Color Play Book, and Log Cabin Quilts.

Jean Foots, Special Activities, reminded members that the next off-year Opportunity Quilt special event will be held at the West Mobile Baptist Church on April 30, 2016 from 9 to 4. Volunteers will be needed.

This month Joyce Reed presented 2 quilts of valor: one to a World War II nurse in Fairhope and another to a Vietnam Vet in Montgomery. She needs more quilts for presentation on Veterans Day in November. She welcomes donations for fabric and help with the sewing.

The 2017 Quilt Show chairs, Georgia McCain and Ann Singleton, recommended the Abba Temple as a venue. A motion to accept this venue for the May 5th and 6th Show was made by Georgia, seconded by Wilma Toney, and approved by the members. Yvonne Taylor and Sylvia Dowdle have agreed to wrap and do bows for baskets to be offered at the show. It was suggested that 5 or so members get together to create an individual basket. The baskets do not have to be related to quilting. Other chairs are still needed – especially for the publicity committee. Note that there is material to help with informing the community about this event. Please sign up soon to help in anyway you can!

Susan Morgan will design the Opportunity Quilt for the show and will need help with the sewing. She also hopes we are working on the challenge guilts to be revealed at the August meeting.

Our next retreat will be the 4th weekend in August (Aug. 25 - 28). Susan Garrett will have sign-up sheets at the May, June, and July monthly meetings. Room rates per person are: \$240 for Thursday – Sunday and \$190 for Friday – Sunday. Rooms can accommodate 2 persons.

Exchange blocks will be available next month.

Tia Bourke suggested we have a table each month for "second-hand treasures". Laurie Hickman will assist. The table will be for anything to do with quilting you would like to give away: Books, fabric, etc. If you bring something that is not chosen by anyone, please take it back home.

Other activities this month: Pensacola Quilt Show April 15-16 at the Fairgrounds and the GSQA meeting on April 30th.

Nina Clotfelter from the Art Quilt Group said they are doing "Flower Power" using the Dover book, Decorative Flowers & Leaf Designs by Richard Hoffman. There are 18 people working on this "no-rules" project. She invited others to join in.

Ann Singleton reported that \$81 was collected by Ways & Means. Janice Andrews, Barbara Smith, and Judy Mosley won gift bags.

Bonnie Johnson brought 4 vintage quilts that were made in the 1920's and 1930's that were available for sale

We had several quilts for Show and Tell. The meeting was adjourned at 11:15


Registration is open for Guild Members May - July 12, 2016, then we will open registration to other Guilds in our area.


THINGS WE LEARNED FROM THE JUDGE:

- Piecing thread should match darker color there were numerous times when a light piecing thread showed in a seam or intersection.
- Points and corners make sure the points and corners of pieces have not been cut off or lost when sewing to the adjacent piece
- Quilt should be squared up before adding borders and again before adding binding.
- Strive for 90 degree corners on binding.
- Straight lines should be straight the judge sights down the lines of the sashings and borders to make sure they are perfectly straight and even.
- If you are using a fabric in a border or binding that has a distinct design or pattern line, cut according to the pattern instead of the grain line (they do not always match up) to avoid creating a spiral effect or the appearance of crookedness.
- Machine applied bindings are acceptable, but the same care and precision should be taken as when doing a hand binding
- Use diagonal joins in binding for better appearance and reduced bulk.
