Azalea City Quilters' Guild—General Meeting St. Mark United Methodist Church—January 9, 2018

President Ann Singleton called the meeting to order and welcomed all present. Bonnie Johnson inspired and motivated members to enter quilts in the GSQA Quilt show. Minutes of the December meeting were approved. Ann Singleton read a thank you letter from Pat Guyton, Child Advocacy Center director, thanking the guild for a \$300 donation. Sandy Purvis volunteered to collect the Penny Harvest donations monthly for this cause. Ann also announced a quilt show in DeFuniak Springs, FL February 16-17 sponsored by the Chautauqua Quilters. Location is the DeFuniak Springs Community Center.

Peggy Stone reported a money market balance of \$8,224.86 and a checking account balance of \$11, 206.01. Shawn Sumrall reported membership total of 208 with 6 renewals and 73 present today.

Janet Beaverstock reported on upcoming workshops. Basics of Design Class is full, and the paper pieced Mariner's Compass Class in February has one opening. Shawn Sumrall displayed a sample for this project.

Joyce Reed provided an opportunity for members to join the national Quilts of Valor Foundation for \$5 as a part of the Stars over Mobile Group. February 3 is Quilts of Valor National Sewing Day with chances for prizes. Mobile location will be announced soon.

Lola Terranova invited all to join the Linus quilt sewing. Eleven were present last week. If unable to come, volunteer to quilt or bind the quilts.

Susan Mogan invited members to join the art group's Story of Me project. The display at the Mobile Museum of Art is free to view if you ask for the education department. She showed some sample pieces from the Susan Lenz workshop and discussed the creative prompt that she initiated. Susan discussed her first prompt, which was "time." Bonnie Zabzdyr reported on upcoming GSQA events. The next meeting is January 27 in Baton Rouge with a workshop January 26 called "Hello Fauxgello." The next POE is February 17 in Hattisburg. The Rosebud Luncheon isApril7 and the 2018 Quilt Show is April 13 -14. Deadline to enter quilts is January 20. All GSQA information is available on the Gulf States Quilting website.

Georgia McCain passed out cards for 2018 Resolutions. Anything quilt-related is acceptable, such as attending or teaching a specific class, mastering a new technique, or of course finishing quilts.

- Use small ponytail holders to slip over bobbins to keep thread in place.
- When making triangle blocks on corners of larger block, place a piece of tape on needle line & follow instead of marking each piece. (hope that makes sense)
- Use pipe cleaners looped in coffee stirrer to clean bobbin area of machine.
- Eye Glass cases make good rotary cutter carriers.
- When using monofilament thread, mark tip with magic marker to see it better.
- Use Yoga gloves for free motion quilting. The finger tips are cut out & the palms are "sticky"
- Curling iron gloves are heat resistant & great for pressing squares.

Our Winter Retreat was small, but it was a success. We had lots of sewing going on and lots of UFO's completed. It started very cold, but warmed up nicely.

Since we had to move our Winter Retreat up a week and it coming so close behind Christmas, it has been suggested that we cancel future January retreats. This will be discussed at the next Guild Board Meeting and will have more suggestions to present at future meetings. Thank you all.

QUILTS OF VALOR

National QOV sew date is Feb. 3 and we plan to participate by sewing at Christ United Methodist near Grelot and Hillcrest. We will meet in their hospitality room of the Christ Center building about 9am. Come in the front doors of the church on Grelot and turn right - first floor. Bring your machine

and supplies and any patriotic fabric you may have or you may work on one of our kits. Soups, drink and dessert provided. Bring your own salad or sandwich, if you want, to go with it.

National QOV did 23,785 quilts in 2017. At an average of \$250 per quilt that comes out to approximately \$6 million dollars in quilt materials. At 100 hours per quilt that means 2.4 Million volunteer man/woman hours, and 2 yds of batting per quilt that's about 47,000 yards of batting! We did about 100 of those quilts in Mobile alone. Thanks so much for all you do.

We will again be the recipient of some discretionary funds from City Council to fund a few of our quilts, so be sure and thank Bess Rich when you see her. Thanks for all your help in keeping this group going strong. We will also be sewing on fourth Mondays at Dauphin Island Parkway SAIL center at 1600 Boykin - 9:00 until 3:00. Bring your machine and join us please.

Beginning the New Year of 2018 on January 11th, we had 10 members and one guest, Sally Wall, (who also won the fat quarter prize).


