Azalea City Quilters' Guild—General Meeting St. Mark United Methodist Church—March 13, 2018

Welcome and call to order by President Ann Singleton was followed by an inspiration by Bonnie Johnson. Bonnie described a recent QOV presentation. She also announced that member Elaine Williams was recovering from hip surgery. All members were urged to let Susan Holler know of illnesses or surgeries so that she can send a card.

Patsy Starkey reported an addition to the February minutes. The last exchange block drawing awarded a total of 66 blocks, with 22 blocks going to three recipients. The minutes were approved as corrected.

Treasurer Peggy Stone reported a money market balance of \$8225.54 and a checking account balance of \$11906.01.

Shawn Sumrall reported a membership total of 210 with guest Bennie Johnson and new member Debbie Armitage, with 64 present.

Georgia McCain has received resolutions from 51 members. If you cannot show them at a meeting, contact her to receive credit.

Janet Beaverstock advised that the Color Theory class next week has a few openings. The April 11 workshop is \$35 and the teacher is Martha Ginn presenting "Pathways," a Caryl Bryer Fallert technique.

The next retreat will be August 23 – 26, 2018 with registration starting in April. If not filled in three months, it will be opened to other area guilds. Due to poor attendance at the January retreat, Susan Garrett presented other options to improve participation. It could be moved to February; the venue could change; or be cancelled. Susan explained the activities and costs for benefit of newer members. After much discussion, Georgia McCain moved that a vote be tabled until the next regular meeting. Tia Burke seconded the motion; the motion carried. Susan also announced that the Island Quilters Guild has openings for a Gail Garber workshop "Little Geese, Little Geese Fly Away Home." Contact ACQG member Lois Daverede for information or registration.

Joyce Reed reported that 12 Quilts of Valor have been awarded this year. The next presentation will be April 28 at the VFW in Pascagoula. There is a block "Split Back Star" on the Quilts of Valor Stars Facebook page. Blocks are gratefully appreciated; this is a good way to help if you cannot make an entire quilt. Lola Terranova reported for Linus Quilts. The group meets the first Thursday monthly and all are welcome. She expressed concerns that the Child Advocacy Center and Mobile Police have not been receiving quilts. After much discussion, it was decided that Lola will arrange for Elaine Henderson at the Advocacy Center to speak with Project Linus representative to formally request quilts from ACQG and the Sassy Stitchers.

Patsy Starkey advised that the next exchange block is "Melinda's Bound-tiful Basket." Forty-eight sets were sold today; blocks are due in August.

Susan Mogan reported for Art Group and Challenge Quilt. The current project is Artful Log Cabin. The challenge theme is a 30 x 30 inch modern quilt. Contact Nina Clotfelter for any questions.

Ann Singleton gave the GSQA report. Fat quarter donations were collected today for the Rosebud Luncheon. Monetary donations accepted also. The show is April 13-14 in Slidell at the North Shore Harbor Center. The next meeting is April 28 at the First United Methodist Church at Wright and Palafox Streets, Pensacola, FL. There is a POE May 19 in Louisiana.

Ann Singleton announced that Susan Garret will be quilt show chair with Yvonne Taylor as co-chair. Candy Snipes will chair committee for the Show Quilt and she showed a picture of the proposed pattern.

Ways and Means gift winners were Ramona Thompson, Susan Garrett, Cheryl Hardin, Linda Green, Sandra Griffin, and Bonnie Johnson. Reba Perkins reported income of \$104 collected.

Show and Tell quits were inspiring as always. Resolution quilts need to be reported to Georgia McCain since she had to leave the meeting early.

The program was given by Susan Mogan. She gave a very informative talk on color theory with

- Use diagonal joins in binding for better appearance and reduced bulk.

WORKSHOPS

Our next workshop is on April 11th with Martha Ginn from Hattiesburg. She uses Caryl Bryer Fallert's technique of sewing curved sections (or pathways) to a background. Students will learn by making a small (12") block to understand and practice the method. Then work will begin on a larger design of three pathways on a background that's approximately 30". These could be flying geese, strips, or solid fabric.

The class is 9 to 2:30 at Springhill Baptist. Cost is \$35 which includes Martha's pattern. Space is limited but some openings are still available. Payment is due when registering for the class.

Martha will be presenting the program at our meeting on Wednesday the 11th.

The May workshop on May 15th will be on machine quilting with Nina Clotfelter. Cost is \$45 and due when you register.

On June 19 we will have a Quilts of Valor workshop. There is no charge but this is a good opportunity to work on your resolution to make a Quilt of Valor.
