Janet Beaverstock reported for workshops. May 15 will be Machine Quilting by Nina Clotfelter. A free QOV workshop will be June 19, with use of personal fabric or purchase a kit for \$10. Pat Sloan will teach "Wild and Free" on July 11; cost is \$55.

Yvonne Taylor is accepting registrations for the August Retreat. She reported on filled committee chairs for the 2019 quilt show. Needed positions are for docents (Susan Mogan

The April 2018 "Quilt Talk" newsletter on the GSQA website lists the rules for nominating. Coordinate with Bonnie Zabzdyr to make a nomination.

It is the highest honor awarded by GSQA and indicates active participation in quilting, as well as stimulating and encouraging others in all things relating to quilts and quilt making. This award also reflects volunteer services to the quilt chapter, quilting organizations and projects that benefit the community. The recipient will receive a full scholarship (room, board and classes during seminar) for the upcoming seminar. The scholarship is awarded every year with the winner in the "even" year using it at the following year's seminar.
