Ann Singleton presided and Susan Holler led the inspiration. Minutes of the May meeting were approved. Peggy Stone reported balances of \$8, 226.92 (money market) and \$12, 860.96 (checking account).

Peggy Stone presented nominations for a Slate of officers for 2018-2019: President-Ann Singleton, VP for Membership-Shawn Sumrall, VP for programs-Pam Stephens, Secretary-Lydia Criswell, and Treasurer-Sandy Purvis. There were no nominations from the floor.
