Penny Rug Posies That Sparkle

The beaded edge posies are inspired by penny rugs, on which wool circles of various sizes are stacked on top of each other. Take a break from tradition and instead of sewing the stacked circles in place with embroidery thread using a blanket stitch, replace with beading. Using mostly small size 11 seed beads and slightly larger beads, numerous beaded edge stitches will be taught to bead around the edge of each wool felt circle before stacking and attaching to the background fabric. No prior beading experience necessary.
