QUILTS OF VALOR


Our QOV membership dues expire in May, so I will be collecting them for ACQG at our March and April meetings. Our group dues are \$30 and that will be covered by me. Individual dues are \$5 and go to national QOV. You may give me \$5 cash or a check made out to QOVF with Stars over Mobile in the memo line. Any other monies that we raise or that are donated to our group go through me and on to our account at national to be used to reimburse those who do multiple quilts throughout the year and the expenses they incur in batting, fabric, etc. Sassy Stitchers has also formed their own QOV group locally. You may choose to join either group.

If you can't do a whole quilt, but would like to help any block that is 12.5" (12" finished) is acceptable - stars of any kind help to make a great quilt. They need to be mostly red, white and blue - some use a little gold or grey accent depending on the fabrics and that is fine. We will be awarding 4 quilts at the quilt show on Friday and Cathy Wilson and the Baldwin Co. group will award some on Saturday.

We already have a dozen or so names on our list that have been added since our November presentations and I will plan a separate award ceremony as soon as the quilts are available - several churches will allow us to use their sanctuary or fellowship hall as needed for these. If you'd like to be a part of one of these extra celebrations to help drape quilts please let me know and I can call on you next time around. Thanks for all you do for our veterans - it means so much to them.

Show & Tell: Judy Purcell brought the table runner, placemats, & pot holders she made for a wedding shower, Merry Linda Wilson: her adorable pin cushion, and Bonnie J. displayed the three Quilt of Valor tops made during QOV Mondays in January....what beauties!

The evening topic was reserved for our Friendship Flower Blocks. We had decided to use both submitted patterns last month. But... as I tried to calculate the cost of the strips,

I became weary. Doing the best thing possible, I asked my wonderful math-minded husband, who broke it down to square inches and calculated the price of the background fabric for each packet. We only will make block #2. Due to the amount of background fabric required for block #1, the group decided to not use it--as it would double the cost of the packet. Therefore, the block we make is block #2, using the \$1 packet of instructions and background fabric. Unfortunately, due to my calculation error, it will be an appx 9 1/4" block. Thank you for discerning eyes and helpful hearts. The drawing date will be decided at March or April's meeting.

Next month, Debbie Caudle will give the March program of "Quilting in the United Kingdom and Ireland". Debbie and her husband spent a good deal of time in the area several months ago. We all will be looking forward to your program, Debbie! So, call your friends and let's give Debbie an attentive audience.

Thank you all for your donations to the church's food pantry, and bringing the fat quarters for the drawing, which Bonnie Johnson won.
