

Azalea City Quilters' Guild—General Meeting St. Mark United Methodist Church—May 14, 2019

President, Ann Singleton welcomed members and guests. Bonnie Johnson's inspiration was in honor of Mother's Day. She shared some "big band" era music, Rhapsody in Blue, while displaying Ann Hetrick's quilt by the same name.

Ann shared that Frank Phillips passed away. She also announced the 3-person nominating committee to present a slate of officers to the members; a motion was made, seconded and carried to accept this committee. New officers will be inducted at the August meeting. Ann shared that the program by Carol Jaynes for this meeting (May) has been cancelled and rescheduled for October due to lack of participation in the classes on May 15 & 16. Feelings were that it was too close to the quilt show and folks needed to catch up on their life before taking on a two-day workshop. Ann also shared that the guild has rented a small storage unit to keep our stuff together. You may bring items belonging to the guild to the next meeting to be placed in storage. Elaine Williams will be the compiler for the 2018-19 Guild financials audit. A compiler will be appointed within the next two months for the Quilt Show audit which is due in September. Mary Warfield requested that increases for your budget area need to be turned in quickly as the new budget begins on August 1.

Ann announced that the quilt show award chairs and co-chairs did an outstanding, thank you ladies for a job well done. She reported that 62 people filled these positions and that in total we had over 90 people who served in some volunteer capacity during the show. The Guild members presented Yvonne Taylor and Susan Garrett with a thank you gift in appreciation of their hard work producing a great quilt show. Many husbands volunteered tirelessly during quilt show week and other times as well. They do many heavy-lifting and labor intensive jobs for us. A motion was made, seconded and carried to invite them to our upcoming luncheon to show our appreciation for their commitment to our guild.

In a surprise twist, two ladies again displayed the "Rhapsody in Blue" quilt and Susan announced that it had won the Viewer's Choice Award at the show, catching Ann Hetrick totally off guard! Congratulations Ann, great job on a beautiful quilt!

The April meeting minutes were approved as printed in the Nine-Patch News with no corrections. Treasurer, Sandy Purvis, reported balances of \$4,327.57 in our checking account and \$12,233.27 in our money market account.

Shawn Sumrall reported that 71members including two new members are present today.

Art Group co-chairman, Anne Godwin, shared that the art quilts were displayed on the back wall at the quilt show. She reminded everyone that it's not hard to be involved, there's lots of help for you, so come join the art group.

Patsy Starkey reported that the Exchange Blocks are due in July for the drawing in August.

We were reminded that Night Guild meets at 6:30 pm on Thursday. Remember to bring a fat quarter and a canned good.

Bonnie Zabzdyr reminded us that the "Gift Bag" Challenge will be due at the August meeting.

Ways and Means collected \$116.00 for the un-birthday gift drawing. The winners were: Barbara Smith, Sharon Morris, Pat Hagler (2), and Lola Terranova.

2019 AZALEA QUILT GUILD CHALLENGE

- 1. Choose a gift bag you like. It can be any season.
- 2. Make a quilted representation of that bag.
- 3. You may use any and all colors of fabric you desire.
- 4. Quilt can be pieced, appliquéd, embroidered. Anything goes.
- 5. You may use any sewing or embellishment technique you like. Enjoy the process!
- 6. Quilt can be **NO LARGER** than **30"** SQUARE but can be smaller like mine is. It can be square it can be round, it can be a rectangle, it can be wonky. It can be a

wall

hanging, a pillow, a placemat, a tote bag, etc. The skies the limit.

- 7. Quilt must be completed and bound.
- 8. Entry is due at the August 13th guild meeting. Bring it in a brown paper bag or pillowcase. You must have the bag with your quilt.

WORKSHOPS

Looking ahead: July 10th will be a workshop with Mark Sherman from Murfreesboro, TN. This will be an appliqué focused workshop so appliqué lovers plan ahead! Mark will be speaking at the July 9th meeting.

October—TBA A two-day workshop with Carol Jaynes from Cummings, GA. Carol is a Judy Niemeyer certified teacher. The pattern for the 2 day workshop is "Desert Sky" - a 48" by 54" quilt. Class cost is \$70 and the pattern is \$22. The classes will be at the Regency Church of Christ on University Blvd.
