President Susan Holler welcomed members and guests. Also, please pray for Wilma Toney who is having surgery soon. Susan shared that Vicki Crooms has moved to Somerby and has given up driving. Please remember to share your time with her and bring her to Guild meetings when you can. Susan also thanked 2018-2019 officers and board members for their leadership and service. She shared info about several quilt show opportunities that are coming up. Susan reminded us to park "tight" in the parking lot out front to allow for more cars to fit there. Susan announced that the new board will meet at SHB Activity Center on Thursday, September 26, at 9:30am and the show board meeting will follow at about 11:30am at the same location. Susan called for a vote on the 2019-2020 Budget which was discussed at the August meeting. It passed unanimously.

Yvonne Taylor & Pasty Starkey have the Christmas Hexi-tree exchange block kits available. Completed blocks will be due in December for the drawing. They can be done by hand or machine and can be embellished as well.

Susan Garrett also reported that off-year opportunity quilt is ready and we will sell tickets through August 2020. The quilt is an 80" X 90" size; she will have the photo postcards to advertise
