Azalea City Quilters' Guild—General Meeting St. Mark United Methodist Church—October 8, 2019

President Susan Holler welcomed members and guests. She stated that Pam Stephens and Patsy Starkey have returned today after having surgery recently. She requested prayer for Peggy Fraser, Linda Dyken, and Wilma Toney are all facing surgery soon. Please keep these and others you may know of in your prayers. Susan shared that we have been setup with Amazon Smile to become a recipient of a 0.5% donations from purchases made through their program. There is info in the back today on how you can participate. There will also be more info in the November newsletter. Susan read a sweet thank you note from QOV Recipient, Judge Hardesty, for his quilt.

For our inspiration, Sue Gunther shared that quilting is one way we fulfill the desire God gave us to be creative. We use fabric, color, and design to express our God-given gift of creativity.

The September meeting minutes were approved as printed in the Nine-Patch News with no corrections. Treasurer, Sandy Purvis, reported balances of \$3,228.83 in our checking account and \$12,236.86 in our money market account.

Peggy Stone reported that we have 76 present today which includes 2 new members. She reported that our total membership stands at 266 including 229 membership renewals.

Ann Singleton reminded us that our presenter today, Carol Jaynes, who is a certified Judy Neimeyer teacher, will have a TWO DAY workshop on "Paper Piecing Desert Sky Pattern" October 9 -10. This workshop is at the Regency Church of Christ at 9:00 am both days. There is still room if you wish to attend. She stated that our November program will be our QOV presentation. She reminded us of the QOV workshop on November 13 at the SBC Activity Center.

Mary Ann Logsdon announced that her second Machine Piecing Class will be on November 6 at the SBC Activities Center.

Susan Garrett announced that our new yearbooks will be ready to hand out at the November meeting. She also reminded us to get our off year opportunity quilt tickets. The drawing will be held at our August 2020 meeting.

Peggy Stone announced that there will be a Quilt Show 2021 board meeting today following this general meeting.

Joyce Reed reported on the Quilts of Valor presentations coming up in November as we celebrate Veteran's Day. She thanked everyone for the pillowcases. Joyce said that the city and county budgets may not have any monies to support the QOV effort as in the past. Bonnie Johnson read a thank you note from recent QOV recipient, Jeff. Cathy Wilson reported on the Quilts of Valor program in Baldwin County.

Diane Engels reminded us that the Donation Quilts sew day is on the first Thursday of each month from 9:00-3:00 at the Tillman's Corner Senior Center, Nevius Road. The guild has decided to group all the quilts we make each month for the Linus and Child Advocacy programs under the name of "Donation Quilts" for clarification purposes.

Bonnie Zabzdyr shared that the Block Party meets every Thurs-

day morning at the SBC Activity Center from 10 am to 12 noon. She said it's not a guild, there are no dues and there is no business. Work on whatever you want to or you can just come and sit and talk! She will also help you with any projects you are working on such as paper-piecing the Christmas Tree Exchange Block. She will be announcing the Challenge Block at a later date.

Yvonne Taylor and Patsy Starkey said that we have more of the Christmas Tree Exchange Blocks ready to pickup. The drawing will be held at the December Luncheon Meeting. See Bonnie Zabzdyr if you need help with English paper-piecing!

Bonnie Johnson asked for a show of hands for all GSQA members and requested a very brief meeting following this general meeting to update her records. She shared that the next GSQA Quarterly Meeting will be October 25 & 26 in New Orleans. She also said that planning has begun for the ACQG to host the April 23-25, 2020 meeting in Mobile. We will have Annie Smith teaching the workshops at that meeting.

Susie Olson shared that our donations are still low for our Child Advocacy annual collections. The ACQG Board members are asking the general membership to meet their challenge and make a one-time donation at this meeting. The Board members passed the basket and collected \$70 on the spot! We have the potential to collect the balance we need today! Please give generously. If you are not prepared today, bring it next month!

Bonita Flesher reminded us to check our email on our Birthday month, the guild is sending out cards to all members! Be sure to let her know if we have info about a member who needs a card from the guild.

Bonnie Johnson reminded the officers and committee chairmen again to update their area of the website.

Quilt Show 2021

The dates for the 2021 quilt show will be April 30-May 1. The venue will be the Abba Temple Shrine.

QOV WORKSHOP

QOV workshop planned for Nov. 13 at Springhill Baptist Activities Center, 9 am until. Bring your machine, snips, scissors, favorite cutter and patriotic fabric if you can. If you have a favorite ruler and instructions for a 3 x 6" flying geese, bring them. If you do not have fabric, some will be provided for you. There is no cost, however getting with a friend or two or three and bringing enough fabric for one quilt top is encouraged.

The Split back star block requires

White: $1 - 4 \frac{1}{2}$ " square

8 - 2 ½" squares

Red: 3 - 4 ½" squares

1 - 4 7/8" square

Blue: 3 - 4 ½" squares

1 - 4 7/8" square







20 blocks will be needed to complete the quilt. 1 1/3 yd. each of red and blue should be sufficient to finish a quilt. 1 1/8 yd. white will complete the quilt.

For the **Highlight star** you need 2 fabrics. Main fabric needs to be 75" (2 1/8 yds.) minimum and background needs to be 80" (2 ½ yds.). One red fabric and one blue fabric each about 40" (1 1/8 yds.) could be used for alternating colorways on main fabrics. Twelve 18" blocks will complete this quilt. So 6 red and 6 blue blocks, or 12 of either one.

The Barn Star block requires:

Cut the following: Four 3 7/8 inch sqs. – blue and background(can be white)

Four 3.5 inch squares – background

One 3.5 inch square – blue with small stars or dots

One 2 x 10 inch rectangle – red

One 2 x 10 inch rectangle – white

20 blocks for a whole quilt top requires 1/3 yd. red and 1/3 yd. white for center of star. 1/8 yd small blue star or dots print 2/3 yd. solid/tone on tone blue to coordinate with star print 1 1/4 yd. background (may be more of the same white used in center)

Make plans now to attend our QOV workshop on Nov. !3 - Wed. the day after the guild meeting. Bring your own QOV project to work on or plan to help us finish one of the two quilts that I have cut out. I even got the lines drawn on the half square triangles, so you can start sewing immediately if you bring your machine. We start about 9am. Bring your own lunch or plan to go out nearby. We will stitch until 2 or 3pm and hope to complete 2 tops and have them ready for borders. We will be at Springhill Baptist Church Activities Bldg. upstairs. Thanks for all of your help in getting us ready for next years presentations. We are presenting about 30 quilts this November.

We will do presentations at day and night guild meetings, at a DAR meeting, at New Mobilians, at a City Council meeting, at a County Commission meeting, at South Baldwin Republican Women, and at New Haven Baptist Church in the next month. Two quilts will go with Commissioner Connie Hudson to a family gathering in NC Thanksgiving. Her son, a current Lt Commander, and his grandfather who served in Korea will both receive quilts we have made presented by local quilters there at a family reunion. Our veterans say many thanks.
