Azalea City Quilters' Guild—General Meeting St. Mark United Methodist Church—November 12, 2019

The meeting was called to order by Susan Holler, President. She announced that the order of business would be changed today for the Quilts of Valor presentation.

Inspiration by Sue Gunter focused on "Gratitude". To be grateful we have to remind ourselves of our blessings. It takes practice to be in a grateful state of mine.

After leading the Pledge of Allegiance, Bonnie Johnson gave a short history of how Quilts of Valor (QOV) began. Joyce Reed read biographies of the recipients. The quilts were presented to John "Skip" Burris, Jr., Omer Oglesly, John McGee and Richard Mortiz. Turner Linwood was unable to attend to due illness. His quilt will be presented at a later date.

The regular order of business was resumed after the completion of the QOV program

Susan Holler stated that Linda Dyken, Peggy Fraser and Martha Elia were recovering from surgery. Remember to keep them in your thoughts and prayers. She read a thank you note from the Art Group in appreciation for the Guild helping with the expenses for the Katie Pasquini Masopost workshop. Susan also announced 2020 will be the Guild's fortieth anniversary. The celebration will take place in June 2020. Elaine Williams will chair the committee. If members have memorabilia to share contact Elaine.

The October minutes were approved as printed in the November Nine Patch.

Treasurer, Sandy Purvis, reported a balance of \$2,785.70 in the checking account and \$12,237.59 in the money market account.

VP of Membership, Peggy Stone, reported eight QOV guests and 62 members in attendance. There are 3 new members with a total of 254 member, with 28 members who need to renew.

VP of Programs, Pam Stephens, highlighted the schedule for 2020: January (Trunk Show by Judy Goll); February (Country Store and presentation of quilts and monetary donations to Child Advocacy Center); and March (Sandy Fitzpatrick of Hissyfitz).

Ann Singleton reported there would be a workshop sew day for anyone interested in working on QOV at Springhill Baptist Activity Center on Wednesday, November 13 at 9:30. There will be no workshop in December. The January workshop will be a sew day for donation quilts.

Ann Hetrick reported the library had more activity recently. She introduced two new books that were recently donated.

MaryAnn Logsdon reported there were 15 members at the November 6 Machine Piecing Class. The next class will be December 4, 2019.

Georgia McCain reminded everyone resolutions will need to be completed by the December meeting. She will be contacting members who have not completed their resolutions. Remember for any resolution not completed you will need to provide a fat quarter. The prizes consist of 4 gift cards from Block Therapy, a Bag of Goodies and the fat quarters.

Susan Holler gave Susan Garrett's reports: Retreat will be August 27-30, 2020, cost remains the same. registration begins in April. Opportunity Quilt, \$153.00 of raffle tickets were sold at the Pecan Festival. If anyone knows of any events starting in January, please let Susan Garrett know as she would like to show the quilt once a month. Yearbook: Peggy Stone has the books and is handing them out. She was able to compress the PDF version and can send it out if you know how to extract this information. Please let her know if you want her to email it to you.

Peggy Stone, 2021 Quilt Show Chair, announced a treasurer has been selected. Resumes for quilt judges have been received and will be reviewed.

Joyce Reed announced that there will be more QOV presentations in Mobile this month.

Cathy Wilson, Baldwin County QOV representative, announced they had presented 33 quilts at their programs. She said a video of their QOV presentations was sent to Channel 5 who contacted her asking for more information. She encouraged everyone to send in videos to different tv stations. They are interested in these types of presentations. Bonnie Johnson reported that there is a group of ACQG and Christ United Methodist Church members who meet monthly and make QOV quilts for presentation to members' family or friends. Their minister included information about QOV during Sunday's service.

Bonnie Johnson reported on Gulf States Quilting Association (GSQA). Our guild has 30 members and 9 attended the October quarterly meeting in New Orleans. GSQA has a memorial each year honoring deceased members. Linda Onkerdonk, Joan Dodici and Ruth Lord were remembered from our Guild. The April 2020 quarterly meeting will be held by our Guild. We will be responsible for providing breakfast and door prizes. Bonnie showed examples of articles she pulled out of her stash that would be great prizes -- kit projects, small items such as pin cushions or as Bonnie said any other fun quilting thing-of-ma-bob. Please bring to the December or January meeting. She will also need gift bags donated.

Linda Evans reported that Night Guild will present a QOV at the November meeting. Friendship Blocks (a fall leaf) will be available. Remember to bring a fat quarter and food items for the Church's food bank. An idea to complete QOV blocks is being considered. December will be the Christmas Party.

Anne Godwin reported that the November Art Group meeting will be a class taught by several members of techniques taught by Katie Pasquini Masopost.

Patsy Starkey reported that all 50 Christmas Tree Exchange Blocks were sold. There is still time to complete and turn in your blocks at the December meeting. Patsy said there would possibly be 3 sets drawn.

Susie Olsen reported that the response to the chal-

There being no further business, the meeting was adjourned by President Susan Holler.

PLEASE NOTE

As part of the last Azalea City Quilters' Guild Board Meeting on September 26, 2019, a motion was made and approved to set up a committee to research moving the monthly day meeting to Regency Church of Christ, 501 S University Blvd, Mobile, AL.

Bonnie Johnson, Peggy Stone, Ann Singleton, Pam Stephens and Susan Holler met at the church on Wednesday, November 6 to look at the facilities.

We would be able to use the entrance lobby to set up tables for the same purposes that are now located in the rear portion of St. Mark UMC.

The meeting would be held in their auditorium (this becomes their sanctuary on Sunday when members are present).

There is a small room adjacent to the auditorium that could be used to store the library and other items we presently store at St. Mark UMC.

Down the hallway from the auditorium is their fellowship hall that could be used for our luncheon meetings (and for our 2020 birthday celebration).

The advantages of moving the location of the morning meeting:

- More space as the number of members attending the meeting increase, we need larger space.
- Parking there is parking on the front of the church and in the rear.
- Air Conditioner this is a newer building and we think the systems will handle the hot weather in a more efficient manner.
- Kitchen facilities the kitchen is located adjacent to the fellowship hall and has warming ovens and refrigerators to keep the food dishes at the proper temperature. It also has an ice machine.
- Minimal setup We would meet in the auditorium that has padded pews and would not need to set up table and chairs except for the months we have a luncheon or other special events. Table set up would still be needed on a monthly basis for sign-in, workshops, retreats, exchange blocks, ways and means, etc. Set-up would need to be done on Tuesday morning as the church has an exercise class that meets in the fellowship hall on Monday nights.
- We would be able to use their sound system. Our sound system would still be available for use in the fellowship hall.
- As stated above, there is space to store our library and other items we presently store at St. Mark UMC.
- The cost to the guild would not change.

Per the By-Laws of the Guild, the Board of Directors and Standing Committees have voted to make this move. We now need approval from the membership to make the move. This notice will be sent to all the members via email and will also be included in the December newsletter. The members will be asked to vote at the December luncheon. If approved by the membership, the first meeting will be held at the new location in January 2020.


NIGHT GUILD NEWS

Lunch will be provided; T - shirts have been donated by one of our sponsors - Thrivent Financial, and we will hopefully have blocks cut and ready to assemble.
