On February 18, 2020, Janet Beaverstock will be teaching a Bag Class from 9:30 am to 2:00 pm at Springhill Baptist Activity Center. There is no charge for the class. You will need 1 ¼ yards for the bag, ¾ yard for the lining and a large button (which can be added later). Bring your machine, usual sewing supplies, Rotary Cutter, 24" ruler, tape measure, pins and matching thread. Don't forget your lunch. There is a microwave available. It is not too late to sign up for this class.

The March workshop by Sandy Fitzsimmons will be a wall hanging. It will be a great lesson on machine applique. Go to hissyfitz design.com, then to workshops. A picture of Georgeous Gords should hook you for this class. Sandy will be the program speaker at the March 10^{th} Guild Meeting. The workshop will be Wednesday, March 11, 2020 and will be held at Regency Church of Christ from 9:30 am to 3:00 pm. The cost of the workshop will be \$30 plus the price of the pattern. 
Bonnie Johnson would appreciate the donation. Remember, the Country Store is not a fund raiser for the guild. The transactions are between the guild members.

Pam Stephens welcomed all of us to our new meeting venue, Regency Church of Christ. As a member of the church and the guild she has worked tirelessly with both organizations to make this a reality. Susan Holler also stated that we want to be good neighbors here and so we were asked to please not bring food or drinks in the church auditorium.

President Susan Holler welcomed members and guests. She expressed a big thank you to Ann Hetrick, Bonnie Johnson, Pam Stephens, MaryAnn Logsdon and Ann Singleton for the many hours they gave to help with the move from St. Mark UMC to Regency Church of Christ. Thank you to Bonnie and Ron Johnson for donating the funds to allow us to hire a mover. We were reminded to remember a number of our members with health issues.

Susan reminded our many new members that questions about the programs and workshops for 2020 can be found in the front of our yearbook. It is also known as the guild directory. In addition, our committees and committee chairs can be found there as well as a directory of our membership with photos. She also announced that a Santa Rosa Guild is having a quilt show February 14-15, 2020. There is more info on table in back.

The December meeting minutes were approved as printed in the Nine-Patch News with no corrections. Susan Garrett announced that our new yearbooks are available. Also remember to get the off-year opportunity quilt tickets. The drawing will be held at our August 2020 meeting. Susan also reminded us that our only retreat for the year will be August 27-30, 2020 so start making your plans now.

Peggy Stone announced that the Quilt Show 2021 Board Meeting was held with 9 people attending. Plans are being made to have a sew day to work on the show quilt. Also noted that more committee members are needed, please contact her to volunteer. Our show judge has been chosen.

Joyce Reed reported on the QOV Sew Day on 2/1 at CUMC on Grelot Rd. She has T-Shirts for all who participate. She also reported on the 4-H Project on 2/27 & 2/28 from 9am to 3pm at the Fairgrounds. This is a project to help young quilters learn how to make quilts. You will need to bring your machine, contact Joyce with other questions and details.

Susie Olsen announced that we have exceeded our goal for the Child Advocacy Ctr with our donation of \$404.75. Bonnie Johnson gave a report on the GSQA Quarterly meeting to be on January 25 in Baton

Rouge. Bonnie also updated us on the progress for the GSQA quarterly meeting to be hosted by ACQG in April in Mobile at Regency Church of Christ. We need a lot of help from all of the members for this to be successful.

Night Guild will meet this Thursday, January 16. Bonnie Johnson will lead a workshop on making tissue holders using a fat quarter.



2020 AZALEA GUILD CHALLENGE ISSUED AT THE JANUARY 2020 MEETING – DUE AT THE JUNE MEETING

The challenge is "The Piecemakers Challenge" in honor of the original members that started our guild.

- 1. Entries should be no larger than 30" square
- 2. The original members met weekly and chose traditional blocks to make so I chose 6 beginner blocks. You must use at least 2 of them or you may use all of them. These two blocks must be pieced. The blocks are Monkey Wrench, Flying Geese, Square in a Square, Patience Corner, Four Patch and Nine Patch. They must appear in the front of the quilt.
- 3. You must use pink and green fabrics in the body of the quilt, not just the binding or backing but you may add other colors.
- 4. You may add applique and/or bling if you like.
- 5. The quilt should depict quilts, quilting, quilting items, quilt words, sewing, etc.
- 6. All entries must be quilted and finished.
