Carol Balch is looking for church groups who sew for charity. She has fabric that Kathryn Palmer wishes to donate.


The un-birthday gifts were presented to: Pam Stephens, Sue Gunter, Rose Nelson, and Patsy Starkey.

It was decided that the drawing for the block kits from 2019 would be extended to the month of March.

Linda handed out kits for the stars which will be made for QOV-Mobile. We also discussed that members could make their own stars but should include a minimum of 10 stars for each quilt. The finished size of the star is 12.5"

Show and tell participation was by Syl Mooring, Elaine Williams, and Linda Evans. All of them presented beautiful quilts. Then, Bonnie Johnson threw in an educational lesson. She bought 5 yards of fabric from a well-known fabric store, washed it once, and it went from burgundy to pink on the first wash. The second and third wash was even worse. Elaine Williams presented the program on curved piecing. She actually added a few of her own personal steps from a pattern that made the piecing easier. It was brought to her attention that many of her principles were used in the Judy Niemeyer course. And she gave it away for free!

2020 AZALEA GUILD CHALLENGE ISSUED AT THE JANUARY 2020 MEETING – DUE AT THE JUNE MEETING

The challenge is "The Piecemakers Challenge" in honor of the original members that started our guild.

- 1. Entries should be no larger than 30" square
- 2. The original members met weekly and chose traditional blocks to make so I chose 6 beginner blocks. You must use at least 2 of them or you may use all of them. These two blocks must be pieced. The blocks are Monkey Wrench, Flying Geese, Square in a Square, Patience Corner, Four Patch and Nine Patch. They must appear in the front of the quilt.
- 3. You must use pink and green fabrics in the body of the quilt, not just the binding or backing but you may add other colors.
- 4. You may add applique and/or bling if you like.
- 5. The quilt should depict quilts, quilting, quilting items, quilt words, sewing, etc.
- 6. All entries must be quilted and finished.

ART GROUP

One of our own, Nina Clotfelter, will be teaching at the Houston Quilt Festival this year. Many of us in the Guild have been students of Nina. She is an excellent teacher and we are very proud of her accomplishments.

As usual, this group has several projects going on. "In the Garden" is almost ready and we are supposed to look at everyone's work at the February meeting. Letters were handed out to embellish. They will spell Azalea City Quilters Art Group. The letters will be used when we display projects at different venues. The eye project is moving along. There are several other projects in the works.
