These were the rules:

1. No kits.

2. There will be machine piecing, but no machine quilting.

3. Any size quilt allowed, but NO pillows, clothing, wall hangings, etc.

4. No painted quilts allowed.

We can thank the founding members for starting

a wonderful tradition. The rules are now different, but we are still the pride of Mobile quilters and we show it every two years.



2020 AZALEA GUILD CHALLENGE ISSUED AT THE JANUARY 2020 MEETING – DUE AT THE JUNE MEETING

The challenge is "The Piecemakers Challenge" in honor of the original members that started our guild.

- 1. Entries should be no larger than 30" square
- 2. The original members met weekly and chose traditional blocks to make so I chose 6 beginner blocks. You must use at least 2 of them or you may use all of them. These two blocks must be pieced. The blocks are Monkey Wrench, Flying Geese, Square in a Square, Patience Corner, Four Patch and Nine Patch. They must appear in the front of the quilt.
- 3. You must use pink and green fabrics in the body of the quilt, not just the binding or backing but you may add other colors.
- 4. You may add applique and/or bling if you like.
- 5. The quilt should depict quilts, quilting, quilting items, quilt words, sewing, etc.
- 6. All entries must be quilted and finished.

While we are working to finish those UFOs! Let's revisit this:

THINGS WE LEARNED FROM THE JUDGE:

We were blessed to have a very thorough and knowledgeable judge for our quilt show. There were several constructive criticism remarks that she made repeatedly while judging, and we thought it might be helpful for guild members to know for future reference. They were:

1) Piecing thread should match darker color - there were numerous times when a light piecing thread showed in a seam or intersection.

2) Points and corners - make sure the points and corners of pieces have not been cut off or lost when sewing to the adjacent piece

3) Quilt should be squared up before adding borders and again before adding binding.

4) Strive for 90 degree corners on binding.

5) Straight lines should be straight - the judge sights down the lines of the sashings and borders to make sure they are perfectly straight and even.

6) If you are using a fabric in a border or binding that has a distinct design or pattern line, cut according to the pattern instead of the grain line (they do not always match up) to avoid creating a spiral effect or the appearance of crookedness.

7) Machine applied bindings are acceptable, but the same care and precision should be taken as when doing a hand binding

8) Use diagonal joins in binding for better appearance and reduced bulk.

9) Batting should completely fill binding.

10) Binding should be same width on the back as it is on the front of the quilt.

11) Finishing touches - make sure all loose threads are clipped, and go over quilt with a lint roller to remove pet hair and lint.


The judge also had lots of very positive things to say, and was very impressed with a large number of quilts. She had lots of good things to say about color choices and the quality of the work, both in construction and quilting. She was also impressed at how many hand quilters we have. Madeline was very thorough and precise, and spent time really looking at each quilt. It was both enjoyable and educational watching and listening to her work. We hope these tips will help everyone for the next show.


Fun and Free Quilt Blocks Online



Goose In The Pond

This traditional Goose in the Pond quilt pattern is made up of 25 squares. It's a great project to use up small scraps and is good for pillow cushions or other small projects.

The quilt square is composed of five plain squares, 12 triangle squares, four nine-patch squares and three striped squares. The standard block size for this pattern is 15 inches, but it can be adjusted to fit your project.




Crazy Ann

The Crazy Ann quilt block is deceivingly simple to create. It is all straight seam sewing and uses three colors to achieve a complex-appearing whirligig pattern that's been popular for centuries. This Crazy Ann variation uses three colors, but the quilt pattern can also be made using only two colors.

Make sure that the four-pieced squares are sequenced identically in all the blocks to keep the whirl-like movement consistent. Four sets of oblong triangle combinations are sewn together to create the whirligig center. The Crazy Ann block is completed with the addition of the four corner squares.

FYI: 4 Piecemaker's Challenge blocks


Monkey wrench
