# Azalea City Quilters' Guild—General Meeting: September 14, 2021

**Welcome and Opening Remarks.** Susan Mogan, President, Azalea City Quilter's Guild, opened the monthly meeting at 1005. She welcomed everyone and acknowledged any visitors. Susan requested we remember Susan Garrett and Sue Gunter in our prayers. She introduced Ashley Fleming as a new member of the ACQG and stated she will doing the inspiration for ACQG.

**Inspirational.** Ashley Fleming remarked she is happy to be a part of ACQG and is looking forward to doing the monthly inspiration for the general membership meetings. She told a short story on how one person can make a difference and said a short prayer.

**General Remarks.** Susan Mogan introduced the officers and committee chairs for 2021 and asked them to stand. She stated she will try to make the meeting short and has asked the committee chairs to keep their talks to a minimum. A new section will be included in the Newsletter for the committee chairs to let the membership know what is happening with each committee. The ACQG Board felt a review of the current Constitution and By-Laws was needed. A committee was formed to review the Constitution and By-Laws. This committee consist of Susan Mogan, President; Susie Olsen, Treasurer; Karen Gordon, Secretary; Diane Engels, Donation Quilts; Bennie Johnson, Sunshine; Ann Hetrick, Library; and Ann Singleton, Parliamentarian. The members of this committee has past officers of ACQG and new member on it. It is a good cross section of the Guild. If any one has any suggestions concerning the Constitution and By Laws of ACQG, please feel free to speak to any of these ladies. Susan asked if the minutes from last month's meeting published in the Newsletter was accepted. Diane Engels motioned to accept the minutes as written. Ann Godwin seconded the motion. The motion to accept the minutes as written was accepted, with no objections.

**Treasurer's Report.** Susie Olsen presented the August 2021 Treasurer's Report. A copy is attached. Susie requested that the membership use Amazon Smile when ordering from Amazon. It is "free money" to ACQG and it is easy to use. She offered to show members how to use it.

**Membership.** Janora Parker stated that ACQG currently has 204 members, with 164 who have renewed their membership for 2022. There were 54 members present for this meeting.

**Programs.** Linda Flores stated that the applique program has been postponed until we can figure out how to maintain social distance for the safety of the membership. The Book Club will meet at Jason's Deli immediately after the meeting at Jason's Deli. The new book for next month is Dangerous Threads by Dave Ciambrone. The Art Group will presenting some of their work for today's program. Linda asked the membership if they would like to play a game of "Quilter's Strip Poker". She has a deck of Quilter's card for Strip Poker. The cards all have different block instructions using 2 ½ inch strips of material. She would like everyone to take one home and make the block on the card, for the Donation Quilts, either for the children or for Quilts of Valor. You can make as many as you like. Bring them back for the October meeting to be sewn together for the Donation Quilts. A prizes will be awarded for who makes the most blocks using their card.

**FY 2022 Budget.** Mary Warfield presented the FY 2022 budget to the membership. Debbie Vice, Budget Chair, was not available. Mary stated that the proposed FY 2022 budget was approved by the Board of Directors on 10 September. She stated the fiscal year runs from 1 August 2021 to 31 July 2022. Mary explained how the budget was prepared and the differences from FY 21 to FY 22. A motion was made by Janet Beaverstock to approve the FY 22 ACQG budget as presented. Susan Garrett seconded the motion. A vote was presented to the membership. The FY 22 ACQG Budget passed with no objections.

**Education.** Maryann Logsdon stated that she will be starting a new machine piecing class on 6 October 2021. It will be held at the Springhill Baptist Church Activity Center, from 1 P. M. to 4 P. M. on the first Wednesday of the month for nine months. When the class is completed each participant will have a full size quilt. A sign up sheet was passed around the meeting.

**Website/Quilt Show.** Peggy Stone requested that each committee chair send her updated information on their respective committees. Discussions for the 2023 Quilt Show will start in January 2022. She requested if any money is still out for the 2021 Quilt Show to please turn it in to her. She is still not able to finalize the money for the 2021 Opportunity Quilt. Refunds have not been received, as of yet, from the Abba Shrine or the company for hanging the quilts. The 2023 Quilt Show still needs to fill several officers for this show. Most notably, the Country Store needs an

individual to take that position. Most of the work has been completed, so the 2023 Quilt Show should be easy to complete. Refunds for quilt fees for the 2021 Quilt Show need to be submitted to Susan Garrett in writing (not email) to her home address by 1 December 2021. This needs to be done to maintain a paper trail for records. Refunds for quilt fees for the 2021 show that have not been received by 1 December will be considered a donation to the quilt fund. No quilt fees for the 2021 Quilt Show will be "carried over" to the 2023 Quilt Show. All fees will have to be paid again. **Emails/Yearbook/Retreat/Off-Year Quilt.** Susan Garrett requested emails that should be sent to the general membership of ACQG be sent to the Guild's email address – <u>ACQG2018@yahoo.com</u>. Do not send them to her personal email account. These emails need to have what the email is about in the subject line, not "Forward to guild members". Also, if a response is needed for the email, include the contact information in the body of the email. If a member would like a picture in the yearbook, or if she wants to update her picture, she needs to send a copy to Susan's personal email address (susan.garrett@att.net), by the end of September. The new yearbook will be available at the November 2021 meeting. This year's retreat had a small group – 21 members, but it was a good retreat. It was cut short due to Hurricane Ida. The cost of next year's retreat will be going up in cost. Beckwith is raising fees between \$10 to \$15. The Off-Year Quilt is in the works. The kit has been received and we should be able to start selling tickets in January 2022.

**Workshops.** The workshop chair is currently vacant. Ann Singleton stated that the table runner workshop scheduled in September has been postponed. The instructor did not feel comfortable traveling due to the COVID 19 spike. In October, a workshop has been scheduled for sewing Donation Quilts.

**Donation Quilts.** Diane Engels stated she delivered 70 quilts to the Child Advocacy Center and 70 quilts to Linus. She thanked Bonnie Johnson for printing the labels for the quilts. She read a "thank you" letter for the Child Advocacy Center for 35 quilts that they received. Diane delivered the other 35 quilts after this letter was written. On 19 October, the Tuesday after the next guild meeting, a sew day is scheduled for Donation Quilts and Quilts of Valor. The kits will be provided, and the sew day will be held at the Regency Church of Christ between 8:30 A. M. and 2 P. M. Diane also showed the membership strip quilts she is making using "used dryer sheets" as backing, instead of muslin. She requested member bring their used dryer sheet to her, so she doesn't have to purchase muslin.

**Child Advocacy.** Sandy Purvis stated ACQG has raised \$100 for the Child Advocacy Center. The goal for 2022 is \$350. A basket is in the back for donations.

**Secretary.** Karen Gordon read a thank you letter that Bonnie and Ron Johnson received from the Mobile SPCA for "pet pillows" made by ACQG.

**Exchange Blocks.** Georgia McCain showed the December exchange block. She has five complete quilts from the September Exchange Block. These blocks were given away at this meeting. The winners of the September Exchange Blocks were Susan Garrett, Tia Bourke, Terry Garmendia, Jeanne McCawley, and Diane Engels.

**Ways & Means.** Lee Patrick and Sharon Morris presented the "Un-birthday" gifts for raffle. A total of \$90.00 was received. Winners for the "Un-birthday Gifts" were Gini Danford, Ann Hetrick, Peggy Stone, Lamoyn Keenlyne, Susan Holler, and Ann Singleton.

**Show & Tell.** The members who presented items for Show & Tell were Sandy Purvis, Diane Engels, Lola Terranova, Janet Beaverstock, Jeanne McCawley, Reba Perkins, Fan Murray, Genny Stanford, and Linda Flores.

**Art Group Presentation.** Susan Mogan, Art Group Chair, introduced the members of the Art Group and explained that the Art Group is a subgroup of the ACQG and has over 20 members. She stated anyone in ACQG can join and it doesn't matter what level you are in quilting as an art form. Several sampling of projects the Art Group completed were shown to the ACQG membership.

**Closing Remarks.** Susan Mogan, President, ACQG, stated that the membership of ACQG is large and quite a few of the members do not know one another. She asked if the members would introduce themselves to each other. She also suggested that the members complete a form and she will introduce two members at the meetings. She asked if the membership would be interested in doing this. If they were to please hold their hands up. A majority of the group held their hands up. Susan stated she would work on "something" and get back to the membership.
