Minutes: 11/9/2021 General Meeting

Welcome and Opening Remarks. Susan Mogan, President, Azalea City Quilter's Guild, opened the monthly meeting at 10:05. She welcome the Guild and special guest. We will be conducting the presentation before the business meeting.

Inspirational. Ashley Fleming spoke about the history of quilting and explained how we need to teach it to the next generation. She stated that the freedom we enjoy in this country is the same. She thanked the men and women that served in our military and spoke a short prayer expressing our gratitude for them.

Quilts of Valor Presentation. Susan Mogan introduced Joyce Reed, Chair of the Quilts of Valor for the Azalea City Quilter's Guild. Joyce thanked everyone for being at the meeting and led the group with the Pledge of Allegiance. She went on to explained the mission of the Quilts of Valor program and how it got started. Joyce stated that six individuals have been selected to received a quilt this morning and thanked the friends and families present. The book club will be meeting at Jason's Deli after the meeting for lunch and discussion of this month's book. She thanked everyone who attended the sit and sew earlier this month for the "strip poker" blocks that were made. She showed several quilts that were made during that session. Next month's program will be a trunk show of Christmas projects and quilts. She asked everyone to bring their Christmas theme items in for it. She will also be passing out the "Strip Poker" cards for individuals to complete for the January 2022 program.

The February program will be the annual "Country Store". Individuals can bring their quilting items they would like to sell. It will be set up after the meeting. Also in February, Linda is hoping to have a special guest – Sara Watson. Sara lives in Fairhope and design fabrics for Cloud 9 Art Gallery Quilts.

Opportunity Quilt and Quilt Show. Peggy Stone stated that Bonnie Johnson brought the Opportunity Quilt to the Gulf States Quilter's Association. She sold \$140.00 in tickets there. She wanted to thank the individuals who helped this past weekend at the Pecan Festival with showing and selling tickets for the Opportunity Quilts. They raised another \$387.00. She hopes to have the financial report for the Quilt Show completed soon. She is still waiting on the refund from the Abba Shrine. Susan Mogan reminded everyone that it is not too soon to start thinking about the 2023 Quilt Show. Many people are needed to have the show and everyone should start thinking of how they could help.

Workshops. Nina Clotfelter stated she would like everyone's help in what kind of workshops to plan for the guild. She passed out a form asking members to mark or make suggestions on what they would like to have for workshops.

Child Advocacy Center. Sandy Purvis thanked everyone for the tremendous success last month for collecting for the Child Advocacy Center. A total of \$307.00 was collected last month alone, which place us well above the \$350.00 goal which was set. An additional \$70.00 was collected today and as of today a total of \$534.00 will be donated to the Child Advocacy Center. She stated this is an important program and just because we exceeded our goal for the year doesn't mean we should stop giving. The coin basket is still out front and every penny helps.

Quilts of Valor. Joyce Reed thanked everyone for today's presentation. She stated that there are two QOV kits available for anyone who would like to take them and make a quilt. **Resolutions.** Cathy Eilers reminded everyone that resolutions are due next month and if anyone has finished their resolution to let her know. 251-591-2805

Gulf States Quilters Association. Bonnie Johnson told everyone the GSQA Quilt Show for 2022 is scheduled for April 9 and 10, 2022 at the North Shore Harbor Center in Slidell, LA. There will be two themes for this show: "Spirit of the Gulf" and "Blocks of the Gulf Coast". Also, during the show, baskets will be sold. Each guild that is a member of GSQA will donate a

basket of quilting materials. The basket will be sold and that guild will receive half of the money for their basket. Bonnie would like to have everyone donate a fat quarter in the colors of the Azaleas each month for this basket. She has pictures of azaleas to show what colors will be needed.
