The Day quilt sew day was on Tuesday, October 19 with 14 members present. Six people were sewing for Quilts of Valor, and eight were sewing for children's donation quilts. Nearly 300 blocks were made for children quilts, and three tops have been completed.

A huge thank you to everyone who brought dryer sheets, but they MUST be used sheets. If they have not been used in the dryer, the softening chemicals are still in the sheets, and the oils penetrate fabric strips when they are ironed. I have completed two scrappy strip quilts so far, so please continue to bring USED dryer sheets.

I am overwhelmed by the response to the request for fabric pieces large enough to be used for backing on the children quilts. Several completed tops have been matched to backs and are off to the long-armers for quilting.

Thanks so very much for your time, and fabric, so that we may continue to serve the children of our community.

Show Title: *Spirit of the Gulf Coast*. Very appropriate! Two themes: Blocks of the Gulf Coast (4 states) and Log Cabins. Rosebud Luncheon April 2, 2022 at Pinewood Country Club, Slidell. We will start collecting fabrics for our basket SOON! Circuit teachers told about their classes and showed samples. Sherri Herringshaw will be retiring soon so we need to book her class. Yes, most can be adapted to any size quilt: Miniature to King. Marilyn Rose has a neat Checkered Dresden class, too! We showed the 2 Charity Quilts from ACQG and picked up 2 for Peggy S and 1 for Susan H. They revised their By-Laws in a very orderly, quick way. We took note. Yes, we won prizes!! *Bonnie Johnson*

Azalea City Quilters' Guild—General Meeting: October 13, 2021

Welcome and Opening Remarks. Susan Mogan, President, Azalea City Quilter's Guild, opened the monthly meeting at 10:05. She welcomed the Guild. Susan requested we remember in our prayers the following people: Nancy Williams, her mother passed away this week; Trisha Ringer, her daughter is struggling with cancer; and continue to remember Susan Garret, Sue Gunter and Judy Merryman.

Inspirational. Ashley Fleming talked about faith, hope and memories and said a short prayer.

General Remarks. Susan Mogan asked if the Minutes from last month's meeting published in the Newsletter was accepted. Susie Olsen motioned to accepted the minutes as written. Nina Clotfelter seconded the motion. The motion to accept the minutes as written was accepted, with no objections.

Treasurer's Report. Susie Olsen presented the September 2021 Treasurer's Report. A copy will be in the Nine Patch News.

Membership. Janora Parker stated that ACQG currently has 176 members. There were 57 members present for this meeting.

President's Remarks. Susan Mogan stated that the program for today will be at the end of the meeting, since Linda will continue playing Strip Poker with the Guild members. She spoke about the name tags worn around the neck and how many don't like it hanging around their necks. Susan showed the Art Guild magnetic name tag and how it stays on her shirt. She stated that Karen Gordon could get one made for ACQG and it would cost between \$10 and \$13. She asked how many individuals would be interested in looking into this. She stated the new badge would be strictly voluntary. Several members raised their hands and Susan stated Karen will continue looking into getting a magnetic name tag for ACQG. Susan reminded members that if they wanted to get a refund for the 2021 Quilt Show entry fees, they needed to get their requests to Susan Garret as soon as possible. Susan Garret is working on the 2022 Yearbook and they will be out soon. Also to remember to send any emails for distribution to the general membership to the Guild email address - ACQG2018@yahoo.com. Do not send them to Susan's personal email account. Sandy Purvis is still collecting money for the Child Advocacy Center. The goal for 2022 is \$350 and there is a basket is in the back for donations. Member resolutions are due by December and to "remember" to let Cathy Eilers know when you complete one. The annual Country Store for ACQG will be held at Regency Church at the February 2022 meeting in the Fellowship Hall. Trisha Ringer needed to resign as Chairman of Hospitality due to her daughter's struggle with cancer. An individual is needed to fill in to work the annual December program. This is not a big program, just some sort of small individually wrapped "treat" for each member to take with them, due to the COVID issue. Susan announced that the vacant Workshop Chair has been filled. Nina Clotfelter has volunteered for the position.

Education. MaryAnn Logsdon stated the machine piecing class started last week. She had nine individuals show up for the class and another four who could not make the first class, but will be there from now on.

Art Group. Susan Mogan remarked that the Art Group is meeting monthly and is currently working on a "Mystery Quilt".

Donation Quilts. Diane Engels thanked everyone who turned in used dryer sheets. She now has enough sheets to complete several more children's quilts. She showed the meeting a "scrappy" quilt that was completed using the used dryer sheets. She is requesting everyone who might have an "orphan" block or two to donate them to her. She wants to make quilts using all the "orphan" blocks. She is currently looking for large pieces of fabric that could be used as backs to quilts. Not having the backs of the quilts is a huge issue and is stopping her from completing many quilts. Diane is working on a new quilt design for the children and has asked members is they have any pieces of "white on white" fabric, that is large enough to get four 2½ by 4½ pieces to donate them to her. She reminded everyone about the "Sew Day" workshop on October 19 at the Regency Church of Christ Fellowship Hall. She said a sign up sheet was being passed around. If you are coming to bring your sewing machine, thread and whatever tools you might need. All fabric will be provided.

Quilts of Valor. Joyce Reed spoke about the "Take 5" for the QOV. She stated she is signed up and is looking for donation. The "Take 5" is an event, either by walking, running or by sewing. An individual signs up for whatever they want to do and get sponsors to pay them for each item they sew, or each block, mile, etc. that they walk or run. She is number 397. She stated the "Sew Day" workshop scheduled for October 19 will include some QOV work as well as donation quilts. She will have a lot of "hand" work to do, such as sewing labels and bindings on QOV quilts, so if people did not want to carry their sewing machines, they could just come in and work on some hand sewing for QOV. She talked about the annual Quilts of Valor Retreat held in February in Tennessee and if anyone is interested to contact her. **Ways & Means.** Individuals donated five "Un-birthday" Gifts, which raised \$100 today. The gifts were won by Terri Garmendia, Connie Golden, Pam Stevens and Ramona Thompson.

Programs. Linda Flores announced that next month's book for the book club will be "Ghostly Quilts on Main" by Ann Hazelwood and that the book club will meet after the meeting at Jason's Deli to have lunch and discuss this month's book. She stated that the programs for November will be on Quilts of Valor, December will be a "Show & Tell" on Christmas theme items and January will possibly be another game of "Strip Poker". She is still trying to workout how to have an applique program that will allow for the COVID restrictions on distancing. This month's program was "Strip Poker" with the guild members who were present. Linda asked the members who have card to turn in the card along with the items that were made using 2½" strips of cloth. She stated that the members who were present at last months meeting and did not get to play due to her not having enough cards, that she has a consolation prize for them. She asked who had made the most blocks from their playing card. Karen Gordon made 90 blocks using the King of Spade (which was a star with a 4 patch in the middle). She was given the grand prize of a pair of scissors and a stack of fat quarters with a gambling theme. The next top four players received a stack of fat quarters with the gambling theme.

Show & Tell. A large group of items were shown by members of ACQG, including table runners, wall hangings and many quilts.

After Show & Tell, Susan Mogan asked if there was any other business that needed to be addressed. No one stated anything. She adjourned the meeting at 11:10.


