Minutes: 4/12/2022 General Meeting

Welcome and Opening Remarks. Susan Mogan, President, Azalea City Quilters Guild, opened the monthly meeting at 10:00. She welcomed the Guild and any guests visiting this morning. Susan stated we need to remember our members and their families in our prayers. Special requests were made for Patsy Starkey, who will be having back surgery and for Debbie Vice and her family, Debbie's husband is fighting cancer.

Inspirational. Ashley Fleming spoke about how things come together one piece at a time. It is especially true about quilters. How quilters find peace by piecing together our quilts. She spoke about how Easter is a time for peace and hope and how Jesus greeted all with "Peace be with you". Jesus knows everything will work out in time in the way to his will. Ashley said a small prayer thanking the Lord for the peace we find every day.

Correction on the February Minutes. Susan Mogan stated that the part of the 2023 Quilt Show Budget was cut off in the Newsletter and she is considering that as part of the corrections to the March minutes. They will be reprinted in the April Newsletter. She asked if there were any other corrections to the March minutes. No other corrections were noted. Susie Olsen moved to accept the March 2022 minutes as written in the Newsletter with republishing the 2023 Quilt Show Budget as stated. Bonnie Johnson seconded the motion. There were no objections. The March minutes were passed as noted above.

Treasurer's Report. Susie Olsen read the Treasurer's Report for March 2022. A copy will be in the Nine Patch News.

General Announcements. The following announcements were made.

*The Gulf States Quilters Association's quilt show was held on April 9 and 10 in Slidell, LA. ACQG had multiple individual who had quilts in that show. Susan asked everyone who had a quilt in the show to come up and "show" the quilt and state what award they received. ACQG had multiple ribbons awarded.

*New ACQG Name Badge. Karen Gordon will be accepting requests for the new ACQG Name Badge, which was discussed at the March meeting. The new name badge was shown in the March Newsletter. The cost will be \$11.00, and it will be voluntary if a member would like to replace the lanyard we are currently using. We are asking for cash only if you decide you would like one. Currently 32 members have already replaced or ordered a new name badge.

*Night Guild. The ACQG Night Guild will be meeting this month on April 21. There was a conflict with another group, and they needed to change their meeting date. They will be meeting a Christ United Methodist Church on Grelot Road.

*2021 Retreat Audit. Susan asked if anyone would like to volunteer to conduct an audit on the 2021 ACQG Retreat's Funds. A volunteer was not found as of the date of the meeting.. Meet & Greet. Three members were recognized during the April meeting.

They were:: <u>Pam Stevens.</u> Pam has been a member of ACQG for 5 years and has been quilting for 5 years. <u>Nina Clotfelter.</u> Nina has no idea how long she has been in ACQG and has held multiple positions. She is currently the Workshop Chair. <u>Janean McCaw-ley.</u> Jean is a "new" member of ACQG. She joined the Guild a year ago and has been quilting for 2 years.

Membership. Bennie Johnson, Vice President for Membership announced that we have 57 members present at the meeting today. There were 2 visitors today and both have joined the Guild. By Laws and Standing Rules Approval. Susan Mogan explained that a committee worked on updating the By-Laws and Standing Rules for ACQG the past several months. They were presented to the Guild membership last month for review and were also sent to everyone on an email. Susan asked if there were any questions concerning the By-Laws and Standing Rules as they were sent for review. No one had any objections. She asked if we could get a motion to accept the new By-Laws and Standing Rules as written in the email sent to the Guild membership. Pegi Cromartie moved to accept the new By-Laws and Standing Rules as written. Susie Olsen seconded the motion. A vote was brought to the members present. There were objections. The By-Laws and Standing Rules passed. Susan Mogan stated that Bonnie Johnson has offered to have the Constitution and By-Laws of ACQG printed in hard copy for each member. This will be a donation from Bonnie to the Guild. She thanked Bonnie for her generous gift. Guild Challenge. Janet Beaverstock spoke about the Guild Challenge for this year. Kathy will need to choose where the book club will have lunch for next month's discussion. Linda showed several donation quilts she finished using the "Strip Poker" Blocks made in the previous months. She asked if there was anyone who has a block or worked on this quilt to please come up and be recognized.

Today's program will be held right after this meeting. It will be held in the fellowship hall right after the meeting and will be in a "round robin" format. Several members have set up stations to show different applique techniques and groups will move from each station. Linda stated the next program will the "Paint Chip Challenge". She gathered multiple groups of eight different color paint chips and passed them out to guild members who wanted to accept the challenge. Linda stated that the only thing you need to use is at least three of the eight colors in the paint chips you received. The quilt item can be any size. She wants your creativity. Your creation can be shown to the Guild in the next few months. There is no time limit. The paint chip challenge could also be used as part of the Guild Challenge Quilt. Workshops. Nina Clotfelter announced the workshop for September with the Barbara Black workshop being sold out. She will be starting a waiting list for individuals. This month's workshop will be on April 19 with Sarah Watson. She will be showing us different embroidery techniques. Next month's workshop will be on free-motion quilting on a domestic sewing machine on May 11, 2022, at the Regency Church of Christ from 9:30 a.m. to 4:30 p.m. Nina decided to teach this workshop, since several members of ACQG has requested it from her. June workshop will be Andrew Lee, the "Combat Quilter". This is the workshop which was rescheduled from March. It will be held directly after the June meeting and the cost is \$10.00. Susan Mogan thanked Nina for the terrific job she is doing on getting the workshops going again. Susan also asked the members is anyone would be interested in getting a workshop on using a walking foot for quilting and if they are interested to raise their hands. Several members rose their hands. Susan stated she would look into finding an instructor for the workshop and check out the cost. **2023 Quilt Show.** Peggy Stone stated the dates for the 2023 Quilt Show were set. The dates are May 12 and 13, 2023. She stated several members asked if we could increase the number of judged quilts for the show to 300 quilts from the 200 quilts that is already budgeted for. Peggy explained about the cost of the judge and how they would have to pay for another day if we did increase the number of judged quilts. A discussion was held between Peggy and members present at the meeting. No decision was made about increasing the number of judged quilts. As stated earlier in the meeting, the 2023 Quilt Show Budget was not shown in it entirely in the March Newsletter. A complete copy was emailed to the members of ACQG for review and approval. A motion was made to accept the 2023 Quilt

Show Budget as shown in the email by Ann Hetrick and Janet Beaverstock seconded the motion. A vote was put to the members, and it passed as stated.

Gulf States Quilters Association (GSQA). Bonnie Johnson stated she was very pleased with the basket of fat quarters that was a door prize at the GSQA Quilt Show last weekend. She stated it was so heavy from all the material that she needed help to lift it to the table. A woman from New Orleans won the basket. She talked about the GSQA Quarterly Meeting and Workshop that would be held here in Mobile on April 22 & 23. Bonnie thanked everyone who will be helping with the GSQA Workshop next week and asked them to stay after the meeting for a quick meeting on what to do. **Retreat.** Susan Garret announced sign ups this year's retreat and that the cost has gone up. The retreat is scheduled for August 25 thru 28 at Camp Beckwith on Weeks Bay. Meal cost for anyone requesting special meals (vegetarian/glutton free) will be additional \$3.00. The deadline for payment will be August 9. She explained what people have done in the past bringing food for Thursday, the "Secret Quilters" Bags and the door prizes. She stated that she still needs some quilts to be displayed in the chapel for that day and some people to volunteer to stay a few hours at the chapel to talk about the quilts. Quilts of Valor. Joyce Reed was unable to attend the meeting and asked Karen Gordon to speak for her. Joyce is asking for volunteers to work at the Veteran's Blue Star Salute at the Battleship Park on May 21 from 9 a. m. to 1 p. m. She would like someone to show how to make a QOV block, someone to do some handwork (binding/ sewing labels) and someone to explain what QOV is. If you are interested, please contact Joyce Reed.

Library. Susan Mogan spoke about the display of the library books that were in the foyer prior to the meeting and how we have several new books in the Library. She encouraged everyone to check it out for ideas and resource materials.

Exchange Blocks. Georgia McCain stated that she has seven quilt tops to give away for the House Exchange Blocks. The next exchange block will be "Bonnie's Tulips" and she showed what it looked like. She stated she already sold out (over 60 blocks) for this exchange block, but she will have more at the next meeting. The winners for the House Exchange blocks were Terry Jenkins, Ann Singleton, Alma Moates, Tia Bourke, Susan Mogan, Janean McCawley and Sandy Purvis.

Show & Tell. Individuals who were in the GSQA Show showed their award-winning quilts and multiple individuals also showed the quilts they made.

Meeting Adjournment. Susan Mogan asked there was any other business that needed to be address. No one stated anything. She adjourned the meeting at 1150 for the members to attend the applique program being held in the Fellowship Hall.
