# Minutes: 5/10/2022 General Meeting

**Welcome and Opening Remarks.** Susan Mogan, President, Azalea City Quilters Guild, opened the monthly meeting at 10:00. She welcomed the Guild and any guests visiting this morning. Susan stated we need to remember our members and their families in our prayers. Special requests were made for Patsy Starkey, who had back surgery, Debbie Vice and her family, Debbie's husband is fighting cancer and Cora Stewart who will be having a double breast mastectomy.

**Inspirational.** Ashley Fleming spoke about four frogs where happily hopping through the woods, when two of the frogs hopped into a deep well. The two in the well tried hopping out, but the well was too deep. The two up on the top of the well told the two in the well they should just stop jumping, that the well was too deep, and they would never jump that high. One frog listened to them and stopped jumping and just died there at the bottom of the well. The other frog continued jumping and each time he tried he jumped a little higher. He jumped and jumped, until he jumped out of the well. The two frogs at the top could not believe he jump as high as he did. **Corrections for the April Minutes.** Susan Mogan asked if there were other corrections to the April minutes. No corrections were noted. Susie Olsen moved to accept the April 2022 minutes as written in the Newsletter. Reba Perkins seconded the motion. There were no objections. The April minutes were passed as written.

**Treasurer's Report.** Susie Olsen read the Treasurer's Report for April 2022. A copy will be in the Nine Patch News. Susie again reminded everyone when ordering items from Amazon to use the Amazon Smile Program. For each order from Amazon that we use Amazon Smile, a donation will be made to ACQG. **General Announcements.** Susan Mogan made the following announcements.

GSQA Meeting. Susan thanked everyone who helped make the Gulf States Quilters Association's meeting held in Mobile a great success. She thanked Bonnie Johnson, who spearheaded the meeting. The President was so impressed with the way the ACQG did the meeting, she asked Bonnie to complete a notebook that could be passed to the other Guild in the GSQA who will be hosting future meetings. Susan also thanked Peggy Stone for coordinating the food for the meeting and Ron Johnson for setting up.

Change of date for November 2022 Meeting. The November ACQG monthly meeting is falling on 2022 Election Day. Regency Church of Christ is a polling place for the elections. The date for the November 2022 ACQG meeting will need to be changed. It was suggested to either move the meeting to either the Wednesday (November 9) after the regularly scheduled meeting or to the following Tuesday (November 15). A discussion was held and this item was tabled until the next meeting.

Vice President for Programs/Nominating Committee. The position of the Vice President of Programs will become vacant after July 2022. Linda Flores will be stepping down. If anyone was interested in taking this important position. If no one volunteered, a nominating committee will be needed. No one volunteered for the nominating committee. If no one was found for the Vice President for Programs, then starting in August we will not have programs for the monthly meeting. She will bring this issue at the next Quarterly Board Meeting.

Quarterly Board Meeting Date. The next quarterly board meeting for ACQG is scheduled for next Wednesday, 18 May at 9:30 a. m. It will be held at the Springhill Baptist Activity Center. She stated that it is an open meeting and anyone belonging to ACQG can attend the Quarterly Board Meetings.

Birthday and Sympathy Cards. If anyone knows of a member who need either a birthday or sympathy card sent to them to let Bennie Johnson, Vice President of Membership know. She will send an appropriate card to the member.

**Membership.** Bennie Johnson, Vice President for Membership announced that we have 56 members present at the meeting today. We had one visitor and one member renewed her membership. Bennie asked if anyone turned or will be turning 80 before the August ACQG meeting to let her know. Members who are 80 and above will be honored at the luncheon.

**Night Guild.** Elaine Williams visited the Day Guild meeting. She was there to explain what the Night Guild has been doing. She presented Joyce Reeds (QoV Chair) with 15 pillowcases made at Night Guild for the Quilts of Valor quilts. She also showed a QoV quilt made from the strip pokers blocks from a previous program.

**Workshops.** Nina Clotfelter spoke about the Free-Motion Quilting Workshop scheduled tomorrow (May 10). She stated that someone needed to drop the workshop and there was one more spot for anyone who would like to come to the workshop. The Combat Quilter will be here for next month's workshop. This will be a lecture/demo, so anyone that is interested can still sign up, even at next month ACQG meeting. The cost is \$10.00. July's workshop will be held at Regency Church of Christ. Diane Engels will be showing everyone how to make quilts using used dryer sheets and how to quilt as you go with scraps of left-over batting. The August workshop will be Joyce Reed showing how to make Boutique Items for the 2023 Quilt Show. September's workshop is with Barbara Black. This workshop is sold out and a waiting list is made. Check with Nina for details and to get on the waiting list.

**Quilts of Valor.** Joyce Reed announced that the QoV Sew Group has started meeting again at the Humana Office on Airport Blvd. They are meeting the first Tuesday of the month at 10:30 a. m. She asked if anyone has any notions (rulers, pins, etc.) they would like to donate to the group to please let her know. The donated items will be left at the location, so individuals would not need to bring their own items each time. She also stated that renewal for the National Quilts of Valor is happening now. Individuals can go on the Quilts of Valor website to renew the membership, or they can give Joyce the money (\$10.00) and she will send it in for membership. Joyce stated that the annual Blue Star Salute for Veterans will be held from 9:00 a. m. to 1 p. m. on May 21, 2022, at the Battleship Alabama. She is looking for volunteers to help show and explain what QoV is and demonstrate how to make a QoV. A QoV presentation will be held during this time. She is expecting to have 10 to 12 individuals to present quilts to.

**Gulf States Quilter's Association.** Bonnie Johnson thanked everyone for making the Quarterly GSQA meeting a great success. She is very proud of what ACQG accomplished, stating it was the best meeting she had every attended. She thanked Peggy Stone for her work with the food. Peggy stated that the food was as good as it was due to the members who made it. Bonnie recognized all the members who worked the meeting and thanked them again.

**Guild Challenge.** Janet Beaverstock spoke about the Guild Challenge for this year and hopes everyone is thinking about the challenge. "Home Is Where the Heart Is" is the theme for this year. If you decide to accept the challenge it will need to have a heart somewhere on it and be about home. This challenge should be no larger than than 30 inches.

**Child Advocacy Center.** Sandy Purvis spoke about the \$600.00 donation the ACQG gave to the Child Advocacy Center last year. She states it was to the generous donations from the members that we exceeded the amount pledged. She challenged everyone to donate at least \$5.00 before the December meeting, so we may exceed our goal again. If we don't, she will be at the door with her basket asking for money starting in a few months.

**Quilt Show.** Susan Mogan stated that Peggy Stone is the chairman for the 2023 Quilt Show and the dates are set for May 2023. There will be 250 quilts judged during the show. This is an increase from previous shows. Susan said that each member of ACQG is responsible for making the show a success. Members need to either donate items to sell in the Boutique or make a monetary donation of \$15.00. As stated in the By-Laws they also must sell a book tickets to the show. If you have any questions concerning the show you can contact Peggy Stone.

**Semmes Heritage Festival.** Ann Singleton thanked everyone who helped with the Annual Semmes Heritage Festival this past weekend. She announced that we will not be doing the festival next year due to a conflict with the ACQG Quilt Show. Both events are scheduled for the same weekend.

**Library.** Ann Hetrick thanked everyone for using the library and announced the purchase of two new books. She told everyone to come and see what the library has to offer. Ann also told everyone of a Quilt Show being held in Vancleve, MS this Saturday (May 14).

**Donation Quilts.** Diane Engels thanked everyone for giving her their used dryer sheets. She stated she has over 1,000 and she didn't need anymore. Diane asked everyone who has "orphan" blocks around their spaces to give them to her. She is making donation quilts for the children using various "orphan" blocks.

**Programs.** Linda Flores announced that the book club will be meeting today after the meeting at Jason's Deli to discuss this month's books - "The Florabama Ladies' Auxiliary and Sewing Circle" by Lois Battle. Kathy Brooks selected Jason's Deli since she decided what book to read this month. Next month's book was selected by Anne Godwin. We will be reading "The Beach Quilt" by Holly Chamberlain. Anne will be finding a place to meet next month for the lunch and discussion. This month's program is the "Paint Chip Challenge". Last month, Linda passed out multiple groups of eight different color paint chips to guild members who wanted to accept the challenge. The only thing they needed to use is at least three of the eight colors in the paint chips you received. The quilt item can be any size. She wanted creativity. Several members took up the challenge and showed their creations at the meeting.

**Ways and Means (Unbirthday gifts).** Susan Mogan thanked everyone who participated in the "Unbirthday Gifts". She explained that these gifts brought approximately \$1,200 dollars last year and that was a significant amount of money. Sharon Morris stated four unbirthday gifts were received for this month's birthdays. A total of \$87.00 was raised for ACQG. The winners of today's gifts were Peggy Stone, Ann Hetrick, Linda Flores, Darlene Boyd, and Alice Cornelison.

**Show & Tell.** A large group of quilts and other items were shown at Show & Tell from multiple individuals. Photos were taken and are being posted on the ACQG Facebook page for anyone interested in seeing them.

**Final Remarks.** Susan Mogan again reiterated the need for someone to volunteer for the position of Vice President of Programs. If no one takes on this position, there will be no more programs after the July meeting. She also stated that additional help for the 2023 Quilt Show is needed. The Quilt Show Store is looking for one or two more volunteers to help run the store and the position of Publicity Chair is open. Carol Peterson will train the new Publicity Chair. If anyone is interested is either of these positions to see Peggy Stone for more information.

**Meeting Adjournment.** Susan Mogan asked there was any other business that needed to be address. No one stated anything. She adjourned the meeting at 1135.
