# Meeting Minutes: 6/13/2023

Welcome and Opening Remarks. Susan Mogan, President, Azalea City Quilter's Guild welcomed all members and visitors to the June meeting. A prayer request were asked for Mary Reese and her daughter Claire; Bennie Johnson, she will be having surgery this week and for Reba Perkins. Reba will be having knee surgery.

**Inspiration**. Ashely Fleming spoke about how her father painted his home recently. He wanted to keep the same color green, a very light green, with dark green shutters. He like that color and decided to paint it the same. He went into his garage and found a can of paint from the last time the house was painted and took it to the paint store. He asked them to make several five gallon containers of that color green. He gave the paint to the people painting his house and left. When he returned he discovered that the paint he bought was for the shutters and not the main house. That color was a very dark green, almost black. Now his entire house was painted a dark green. He told Ashley about what happened and he decided he liked that dark green better than the light green, so he decided to keep it the dark green. Ashley went on to explain that sometimes, mistakes we make in our lives are sometimes for the better. Just like we all do with the guilts we make. She thanked God for the mistakes we make in life for the better and said a prayer.

Treasurer Report. Susie Olsen read the Treasurer's Report for June concerning the May finances. She stated that the Money Market account's interest for last month was \$38.00. **Membership Report.** Bennie Johnson, Vice President of Membership, announced we have 67 members present. We had two visitors present and both joined the Guild today.

**Correspondence.** Karen Gordon, Secretary, read a thank you letter from the Mobile Big Band Society to the Azalea City Quilter's Guild. The letter thanked ACQG for the donation of the two quilts for their 2023 Dinner Dance. Carol Balch and Debbie Vice, both donated a quilt for the event.

General Announcements. Items at the "Free Table". Susan reminded everyone who brings items for the "free" table at the meeting, will need to bring their items home with them after the meeting if they are not taken by someone. Honorary Members of ACQG. Susan asked everyone who has turned 80 this past year to let the Guild know, so they may be honored at the Annual August luncheon. Committee Chairs. Susan spoke about how there are still three committee chairs that need to be filled - Sunshine, Workshop and Web Master. She spoke about each position. The Sunshine Chair will be responsible for sending out birthday and sympathy card to member of ACQG when needed. The Workshop Chair schedules and facilitates all workshops. The Web Master would be responsible for the ACQG web site, ensuring the information on the web site is correct. If anyone is interested in any of these positions, please contact Susan. GSQA Meeting. Susan announced that ACQG will be hosting the January 2024 GSQA meeting. She spoke of how excited she is that we are hosting and how because of this all ACQG members will be able to attend the program scheduled, even if they are not members of GSQA. She spoke of how we will be needing volunteers to help with it and more will be coming about the event.

**The Quilt Show.** Susan Mogan stated how amazed she was on the Quilt Show and she is very pleased with the turn out. She asked Peggy Stone to come up

and give a brief recap about the Quilt Show. Peggy Stone stated that there are still some things that need to be cleared to get a final profit for the show. Pegi Cromartie, the Treasurer for the Quilt Show is not available at this meeting and she is still working on getting a final report out. Peggy Stone stated that a rough estimate as of last week showed the Quilt Show should bring in a profit of between \$9,000 and \$10,000. There are still a few checks that need to clear before a final profit can be announced.

Nancy Williams, Quilt Show Award Chair, spoke about how she was in the Judging Room with the Judge and watched her make her decisions on what quilt won an award. Nancy spoke about how the Judge kept looking and asking to see various quilts over and over. She stated that the Judge was having a hard time deciding what quilt won. The Judge was impressed with the all the quilts in the show. Nancy stated the there was one ribbon left to present and she held out the "Viewer's Choice" Award. She stated the Emily Krysanick won the "Viewer's Choice" award for her quilt "Nancy Remembered". Peggy Stone announced that the Quilt Show Board will be meeting at Springhill Baptist Activity Center on June 29, 2023, at 12:30 p. m. after the weekly Block Party.

Lemoyn Keenlyne asked Peggy Stone to remain at the front of the meeting. Lemoyn talked about how Peggy worked so hard on the 2023 Quilt Show and also how much she worked on the 2021 Quilt Show before it is canceled due was COVID. Lemoyn stated how Peggy volunteered to continue to be Chair after the 2021 show was canceled and how Peggy worked for the success of the 2023 Quilt Show. Lemoyn presented Peggy Stone with a cash gift that was collected from the members of ACQG as a "Thank You" for all of her hard work for the success of the Quilt Show. The members at the meeting started dapping and gave Peggy Stone a standing ovation.

Presentation of the Proposed 2024 ACQG Officers. Alice Cornelson stated how she and the other members of the Nominating Committee went about selecting the candidates for the various positions. She thanked everyone who volunteers or stepped up to take a position in the Board of Directors. She asked the Guild membership to support these candidates as they take their new positions. Alice announced the candidates for the 2024 Board of Directors are as follows: President is Pam Stevens; Vice President of Programs is Judy Purcell; Vice President of Membership is Susie Olsen; Secretary is Janean McCawley; and Treasurer will be Sharon Nader. Elections will be held at the July meeting and the Officers will be installed at the August Luncheon.

**Cookbook Committee Proposal.** Bonnie Johnson asked to submit a proposal before the Guild from the Cookbook Committee. The proposal is: "A minimum amount of \$1,500.00 stay in the Cookbook Column for one year beginning August 1, 2023 through July 31, 2024 in case a full run or a half run of cookbooks needs to be made. At the end of that year, the ACQG Board will decide on how to go forward with the project." Diane Engels moved to accept the proposal as written and Patty Givhan seconded the proposal. A vote was taken of the members present and it passed with no objections.

Service Project. Susie Olsen asked if ACQG could support a service project for the NICU at Women's and Children's Hospital. She showed a "Bead Bag" and explained the bags are used in the NICU for each child. The nurses place a bead in the bag when the child accomplished a milestone in their care. It could be as little as gaining weight or coming off the respirator unit. She stated that this is a nation wide service project and how the NICU does not have enough bags for each child in their unit. Susie explained how simple they are to make and showed one. She has a sheet explaining how to make one and asked if you are interested to please take a sheet. You can give the completed "Bead Bags" to Susie when you are finish and she will deliver them to the NNICU.

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tions have been set up in the foyer and five different ways to make a flying geese block will be demonstrated by various individuals. Robbie McCardy gave a program on how to teach children how make a quilt. She spoke about how young children do not know the different between a quilt and a blanket. She explained how she teaches children the differences. She stated that there are many books that could either be read or use on how to make a quilt. One of the books she talked about was the "The Quilt Maker's Gift" by Jeff Bumbo and how it tells a story and has many quilt patterns in the book. Ann Hetrick stated that book is in the ACQG Library and is available for checkout.

**Donation Quilts.** Diane Engels spoke about how she was teaching 120 kindergarten through  $4^{th}$  grade students about quilt making at her church's VBS. She stated she gave 40 quilts to the Child Advocacy Center this month, but she has at least 40 more quilt tops at her house to quilt. She stated she brought five of those quilts to the meeting and she asked them to be picked up by someone to quilt. She stated she can not keep up with quilting all the quilt top people give her for the Donation Quilts. That she needs some help with quilting and finishing these quilt tops.

Workshops. Nina Clotfelter, Workshop Chair, talked about the upcoming workshops. June workshop will be on June 20 at 9:30 a. m. and will be held at Springhill Baptist Activity Center. Georgia McCain will be showing us techniques on hand quilting. This workshop has been requested by several individuals in ACQG. This workshop is sold out. July workshop will be on July 18 at 9:30 a. m. and will be held at the Regency Church of Christ. Candy Snipes will be teaching an amazingly fun pattern called Plaid-ish. The cost is \$20.00. August workshop is another "Stripology" workshop. The cost is \$20.00 and you do need to have the "Stripology" ruler. The pattern for this workshop is call "Venus", you will need to purchase it. Once individuals sign up for the workshop, Nina will send a link to purchase this pattern.

**Child Advocacy.** Sandy Purvis stated the basket for donations for the Child Advocacy Center is at the back and she would appreciate anything you can give. She asked for everyone to donate their loose change. The goal for this year is to raise \$350.00 for the Child Advocacy Center.

**Gulf States Quilter's Association/Historian**. Robbie McCardy announced the Quarterly meeting for GSQA will be held in Long Beach, Mississippi on July 22. She stated the workshop will be on designing scrap quilts and if you have any questions to contact her. Joyce has asked if anyone is interested in donated a Quilt of Valor to the National Organization to help ease this back log to please let her know and she will send that quilt to them.

**Education**. No report. MaryAnn Logsdon was not present.

**Resolutions**. No report. Yvonne Taylor was not present.

Ways & Means. Sharon Morris announced that there were seven unbirthday gifts for June and \$109.00 were collected. The winner's of the unbirthday gifts were Patsy Starkey, Sharon Morris, Diane Engels, Betty Todd, Alice Cornelson, Carolyn Stoops and Alma Moates.
