



Quilts Needed for Gee's Production at Joe Jefferson Playhouse!

The Gee's Bend Production is a play that describes the life of notable quilters from Gee's Bend, AL. It is a story rich in both history and culture. It will play at the Joe Jefferson Playhouse Fridays, Saturdays, and Sundays from January 19 to February 4, 2024.

Sharrell Edmond is the Director for this production and would like to think outside of the box. Her goal is to have a quilt installation in the lobby area of JJP where quilts are displayed by different quilters showcasing the talent and history of many signifying the melting pot of people that visit JJP. The quilts will be displayed carefully with signage notating the quilter's name and location. There will also be music played that is reminiscent of grassroots origins. She would love to be able to display some of the work of our organization. It will be highly emphasized that patrons are not to touch the quilts.

They will work setting up the lobby December 27, 2023 to January 10, 2024 so it will be complete by their special performance slated for January 11, 2024.

She is also in need of one specific quilt for the actual production. In the play they mention a wedding quilt which has green in it. If someone had a quilt that could fit that description it would be wonderful.

There has been interest by some in our Guild and I would like to be able to provide pictures to her of the quilts that we are willing to showcase. This is a wonderful opportunity for our Guild. If you are interested in sharing your work, please let me know.


