She sent out the pattern for the National Block for QOV Sew Day. If several people make 4 or 5 blocks, 20 blocks will make a quilt.

Ann Singleton & Janet Beaverstock did a lot as well. Ann read from the ACQG Member Guide about Resolutions - "Each January members can sign up to commit to finish 1 or more

self-determined projects by the end of the year. For each finished resolution, your name is entered to win prizes at the end of the year. For each unfinished resolution, you must pay a fat quarter. Resolutions can be anything quilting related: a project, skill, technique, Guild activity (like the Guild Challenge). Notify the Resolution Chairperson each time you finish one of your resolutions to have your name entered into the prize drawing in December." Ann said going by these suggestions, this could be a project that you are working on and haven't finished or a new project. It doesn't just have to be a quilt. It can be wall hanging, table runner, placemats, or even ses as they are mainly a support/social group. Bonnie a garment. It could also be to learn a new skill like machine applique or free motion quilting. Making an original design would be a good resolution. It's not something you're already doing. Make it specific: ex: Not just helping out with quilt show, but be the chairperson of the quilt show. Put your name, phone # and email on your card. When you finish something, email Ann that you have finished. We need to finish resolutions by November. Can bring fat quarters in November.




