## Meeting Minutes: 2/14/2023

The Quilt Show Country Store is beginning to accept donations of patterns, fabric, rulers, magazines, etc. You may give them to MaryAnn Logsdon or Janean McCawley. Prayer request—Bonita Fletcher's mother, Mildred, is in End-of-life care. Mary Heath fell and broke her hip. Robbie McHardy has family who was diagnosed w/ stage 4 cancer. Millie McCarthy. Sandy Purvis had a procedure today.

Devotion – Ashley Fleming read a poem about the Quilting Flu.

Minutes – Susie Olsen made a motion to approve the January minutes. Reba Perkins 2nd.

Treasurers Report – Sharon Nadar – Report found in the newsletter. Sharon has a new form for Committee members. It will help with accountability and also make deposits easier.

There was a question if someone from Finance Committee had considered about moving money from the General Fund to the Edward Jones account because of the high interest we are making. Sharon said they will bring that up at the Board meeting in March. Susie said we have a budget that we go by and what we have in our treasure should match our budget. It is usually decided at the end of the year whether money needs to be moved over.

Membership – Susie Olsen – We have

83 members today. Total of 213 members. We have 3 guests today: Janice Shelton, Mary Lucus, Delores Pearson. Also, Louann Joswick joined today.

Programs – This month-Country Store. March– Color Theory Presentation from Night Guild. April-Quilt Study Presentation from Sara Wright. May- Pop Up Quilt Shop. (bring your money!) June – Nina Clotfelter is doing a Trunk Show.

Workshop - Kim – Next week is Fanciful Fabric College with Holly Garcia. (have a few more open slots) March – Sew Together Bag with Rose Nelson. (Have some openings. Kim has the pattern which is \$8). April 2nd - Wonderful One Fabric Quilt with Carol Balch. \$20. Kim mentioned she only has a few spots open for Quilt Show Chairs that is needs: Data Entry, Docents, Selling the Show Quilt tickets, and volunteer.

Carol Balch showed samples of fabric that will be needed for the One Fabric Quilt Class. You only use 1 striped fabric. If you want sashing, bring another piece of fabric for it. The yardage of fabric depends on how large your quilt is. She has done a quilt with 3 yards of fabric. The class will meet here in the Fellowship Hall.

Education – MaryAnn – next class is Wed March 6th. Machine Applique.

Library – no report

Child Advocacy – Diane Engels – The Child Advocacy Center is coming to our March meeting. We will be presenting the \$350 check and quilts to them. Linus Project will be coming to the April meeting and we will present quilts to them at that time. This Thursday night at the Night Guild will be a Sew Day for donation quilts. It will be at 6:30 at Christ United Methodist Church. Diane said the size requirements for a Linus quilt is approximately 40"x60". If the quilt is close to that, it's ok.

Exchange Blocks - Georgia McCain – blocks are \$2 each or 3 for \$5. She has approximately a dozen or so blocks left. You need to have them in by April.

Book club – Will meet at Jason's Deli for lunch. Next month's book will be "Tom Lake" by Ann Patchett. She recommended the Hoopla App which has many of the books they read. This book is found on Hoopla.

Quilt Show 2025 is slowly moving along. A date is not confirmed as Abba Shrine is not willing to work on 2025 dates until March. We do have a name for the Show - Simplicity & Elegance, which works well with the Show Quilt idea. Only a few Committee Chairs need to be filled - here is a list and a brief explanation of their duties.

<u>Co-Chair:</u> Assists the quilt show chair in any way needed.

<u>Treasurer:</u> The quilt show has its own separate budget and bank account. The quilt show treasurer handles all finances relating to both the show and the storage unit we use for quilt show supplies. The Treasurer ensures accurate financial records are kept, pays bills, makes all deposits, and handles all cash needs during the show. (I can continue handling this position if I have a Co-Chair).

<u>Docents:</u> Ensures we have people available during the show to answer questions about the quilts, and to turn over the quilts so people can see the back if requested.

<u>Show Quilt Tickets:</u> Responsible for all aspects of selling tickets for the opportunity quilt - purchasing tickets, finding venues to show quilt and sell tickets, coordinating with the Mobile Arts Council to sell tickets online, keeping accurate records to tickets sold and ensuring tickets already turned in are secure. Handles drawing the last day of the show.

<u>Volunteers:</u> Recruits and coordinates guild members to work all areas during the show, and ensures that all areas have adequate staffing both days of the show.

Our Country Store Chairs would like you to be looking at your stash for items to go to the Country Store - especially fabric.

Thank you to those that have taken on a Chair Position; it is greatly appreciated.
