
President's Notes From Pam's Pen:

PET PILLOW/PAD PROJECT UPDATE

Because he delivers to three different locations, Ron Johnson decided to visit in person to again clarify what each would accept. We were taken on a 40-minute tour of the Mobile City Kennels and the laundry room by the young lady who tends to the kennels. She was very grateful for what we do. It is VERY important that the initial instructions on making Pet Pillows are followed, i.e. cotton fabric &/or batting cut into 1" x 1" pieces. The pillows are to be only 2" - 3" tall and must be compactly stuffed, not fluffy. Small or regular sized pillows only, no king size. They will not take old, purchased pillows. Pads are acceptable but must be layered with cotton batting or many layers of fabric and guilted. Here are some approximate sizes for pads: 12" x 18". 15" x 15", 24" x 34". If you have questions, see Bonnie Johnson at the April General Meeting. She will be selling Cookbooks and

will have Pet Pillow/Pad samples for you to see.




